
In October 2024, the Traffic Police City Rawalpindi issued 66594 traffic fines for various traffic violations generating revenue of **51098900** Pkr, highlighting the effectiveness of law enforcement promoting safety. The traffic violations on which fines are issued are 2183 signals

violations, 1076 one way violation, 4282 line and lane violations, 12697 without license, 1929 excessive smoke, 1716 juvenile driving, 1782 without fitness, 2521 rout permit violations and 6933 without helmet violations. This significant amount demonstrates the ongoing commitment of our officers to uphold traffic regulations and ensure compliance among drivers. By addressing infractions such as speeding and improper parking, law enforcement plays a crucial role in maintaining order and safety on the roads. The collected fines serve not only as a deterrent but also as a reminder of the importance of adhering to traffic laws for the well-being of all road users.

ANTI-CONGESTION CAMPAIGN



October. the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi successfully improved traffic flow and reduced congestion at key locations such as Noroz Goods and Fish Market, Mehrabad Aghaz Flyover. Akseer Plaza, Annexy Chowk, Bilal Hospital, TM Chowk. and However, despite the ongoing efforts of the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi to manage traffic congestion, mild congestion continues to be reported at several key points like 6th Road, Adam G Road, 22 Number, and APS Bakery Chowk during school and office hours. Misrial Road. City Sadar Road, Akbar and DAV International



College are also business hubs, attracting a high volume of traffic throughout the day, further contributing to congestion in these areas.

Furthermore, some areas like 502 Workshop, Beacon House School, and Education Turn are still experiencing persistent congestion because of school and office timing. Similarly TNT Chowk, Babu Laal Hussain Road, Fawara Chowk, and Dhama Syedan are also facing problems because these areas are business hubs in Rawalpindi. It is important to note that despite of traffic congestion, no traffic jams were reported as traffic kept on flowing, however, because of huge influx it was slow. Effective traffic management strategies, including timely diversions and well-coordinated signal controls, helped maintain movement, but the sheer number of vehicles in these busy areas naturally resulted in mild traffic congestions.

In October 2024, City Traffic Police Rawalpindi issued 21382 licenses including 19346 licenses of motor cycle, 1860 licenses of motor car, 34 licenses of LTV, 27 HTV, and 116 licenses of motor rickshaw special campaign. This achievement reflects the growing awareness among citizens about the importance of obtaining proper documentation for driving. The increase in license applications

demonstrates a commitment to road safety and responsible driving practices. By ensuring that drivers are adequately trained and licensed, CTP RWP contributes to a safer and more organized traffic environment. This revenue not only supports operational initiatives but also reinforces the vital role of law enforcement in promoting compliance with traffic regulations.



Our Licensing Centers and Mobile Van

The City Traffic Police Rawalpindi offers convenient locations across the region where citizens can apply for driving licenses, making the process accessible to all. The citizens can apply for licensing services at the Traffic Headquarters, Cantt Licensing Center, Shahbaz Sharif Center, and centers in Gujar Khan, Kahuta, Kallar, and Taxila. Each center is equipped to guide applicants through the licensing process efficiently. Additionally, our mobile Licensing Van provides an invaluable service by visiting various areas in Rawalpindi, bringing licensing facilities directly to the community. This initiative allows residents, particularly those in remote areas, to easily access essential licensing services, reflecting our commitment to serving the public effectively and enhancing road safety across the city.





SCO AND CRICKET MATCH SECURITY DUTY



SCO Duty

Regulation of No-Parking on Main Roads

Major main roads are designated as no parking zones in Rawalpindi to ensure smooth traffic flow and enhance safety for all road users. Individuals wishing to park their vehicles are encouraged to utilize nearby parking plazas, which provide safe and convenient options. In cases where parking is absolutely necessary, parallel parking is permitted as long as it is done away from the yellow line markings on the road and for minimal time. This approach helps maintain clear passage for vehicles while accommodating the parking needs of the community, contributing to a more organized and efficient urban environment.

NO OF VEHICLES REMOVED IN NO PARKING



In a recent enforcement operation in October 2024, a total of 5002 vehicles parked in no parking zones have been removed by our dedicated teams. By promptly addressing violations, we aim to ensure that traffic flows smoothly and that the risks associated with improper parking are minimized. The removal of these vehicles not only helps prevent congestion but also reinforces the importance of adhering to parking regulations for the overall safety of the community.

EDUCATION & AWARNESS CAMPAIGN





























ANTI-SMOG

With smog season approaching, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi has intensified vehicle

inspections to reduce harmful emissions. Officers are conducting thorough checks on vehicle smoke levels to ensure compliance with environmental standards and minimize air pollution. By targeting smoke-emitting vehicles, the department aims to reduce smog's impact on public health and create a cleaner, safer environment for all.



ANTI-DENGUE

REVAMPING ROAD SAFETY EQUIPMENTS



Introduction of Foldable Barriers

In a remarkable display of resourcefulness, the City Traffic Police Rawal-pindi's MT (Mechanical Transport) branch took on the challenge of creating foldable barriers for efficient traffic management. While similar barriers cost approximately **400,000** PKR each in the market, our MT staff devised an innovative, cost-effective solution, producing these barriers for only **40,000** PKR each.

Introduction of New Modern Cones

To further enhance traffic management and ensure smoother road operations, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi recently acquired 100 modern traffic cones. These cones, designed with high-visibility colors and durable materials, will improve lane management, especially in high-traffic zones and during peak hours.

Distribution of New Rechargeable Electric Rods

In October, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi took proactive steps to enhance night visibility and safety by equipping our staff with new

rechargeable electric rods. The rechargeable feature ensures sustainability and long-term use, reinforcing our commitment to providing our personnel with the latest tools to manage traffic efficiently, regardless of the time or conditions.

Induction of new 200 Wireless Sets

In October 2024, the City Traffic Police took a significant step forward in enhancing operational efficiency and safety by issuing **200** wireless sets, light rods, and reflective jackets to our personnel.

Distribution of 500 Reflecting **Jackets** In October, the City Traffic Police Department introduced 500 high-visibility reflector jackets for its staff to enhance safety and visibility, particularly during night shifts and in low-light conditions.
