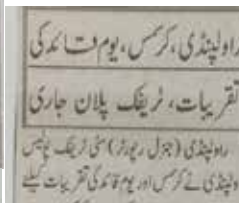
CTP issue 848,000 challans in 2024

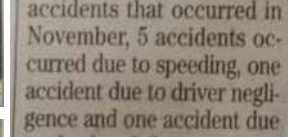
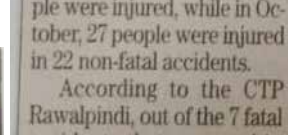
'Fall in traffic accidents'

Due to the strategy of City Traffic Police, there has been a slight reduction in traffic accidents in Rawalpindi. Strict implementation of traffic rules and awareness of the rules was ensured to prevent accidents at every possible level.

Compared to the previous month, 5 fatal accidents and 2 accidents occurred in the city area in November and 2 accidents occurred in the rural area, while on the contrary, 10 accidents occurred in Rawalpindi in October, in which 11 lives were lost.

In November, 7 accidents resulted in 7 lives lost, which is slightly less than in October. There were also 20 non-fatal accidents in November, in which 23 people were injured, while in October, 27 people were injured in 22 non-fatal accidents.

According to the CTP Rawalpindi, out of the 7 fatal accidents that occurred in November, 5 accidents occurred due to speeding, one accident due to driver negligence and one accident due to brake failure, against whose drivers legal action was also taken.

Driving licence centre upgraded

The City Traffic Police has upgraded the Sherbaz Shaheed Park Driving Licence Centre in Rawalpindi to facilitate the public. A spokesman for the traffic police said on Sunday that the upgrade of the centre was completed in a short span of time.

The main objective of the upgrade was to provide citizens with best facilities in obtaining a driving licence and to further improve the quality of services. Under the modern system, applicants will be served in a speedy and transparent manner, said the spokesman.

Chief Traffic Officer (CTO) Ramah Faisal said that the centre had been equipped with latest technology for the convenience of the citizens. She said that the implementation of the new system will not only speed up the process of issuing licences but will also make it possible to resolve complaints.

Earlier, the driving licence centres at the traffic headquarters and Gujjar Khan and Cabri (Sadiq) had been upgraded. Meanwhile, the chief traffic officer continued the process of counselling service traffic assistants and traffic assistants to improve public service and bring positive change in the behaviour of the citizens.

The spokesman said that on a daily basis the personnel were called to the traffic headquarters Race Course and were counseled by the CTO. She instructs the staff to adopt a courteous and professional attitude towards the citizens.

The CTO said that the primary objective of the traffic police was to provide convenience to the citizens and reduce their difficulties. We have to win the trust of the people by our behaviour and improve our performance in such a way that the citizens see the traffic police as their assistant. — Staff Reporter

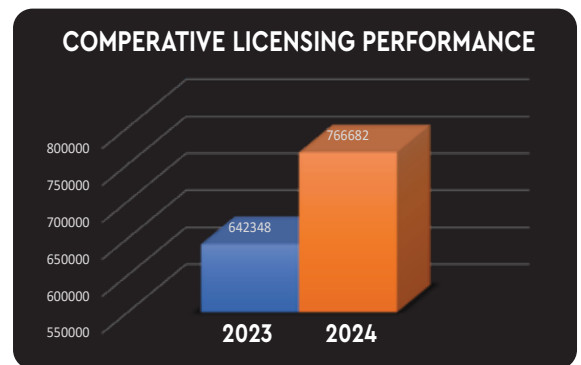

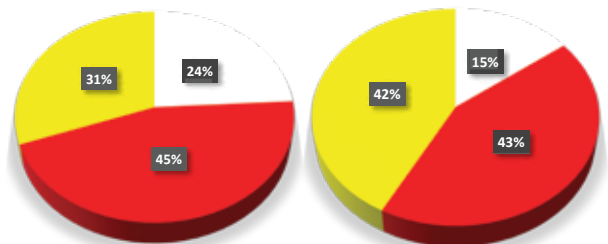

In the last quarter of 2024, as City Traffic Police, we tried to upgrade our capacity to improve service delivery. We started with posting 85% of traffic staff on road duty points increasing our presence on roads. We added 300 new wireless sets to increase connectivity to improve running the traffic and equipped the staff with reflecting rods, unbreakable traffic cones and foldable metal barriers to enable effective functioning. We also upgraded our infrastructure by rebuilding the traffic HQ facade, adding the first mess for traffic police, installing two solar traffic kiosks, renovating the existing licensing center at Cantt and Gujar Khan while making a completely new licensing facility at Shehbaz Sharif Park.

Furthermore we increased the enforcement through lifters for removal of wrong parkings and ticketing for observance of traffic rules. We undertook massive anti-encroachment operations to clear the roads and thoroughfares to improve traffic flow. Resultantly, our congestion points reduced from 290 in July to 93 in December.



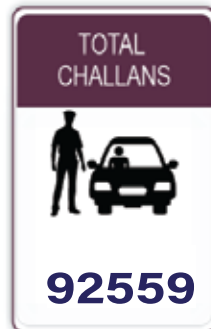
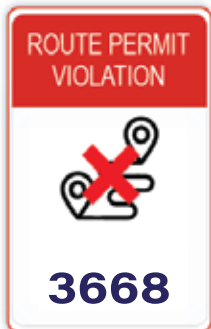
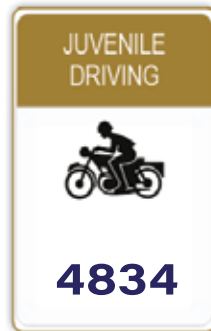
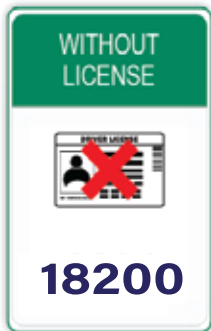
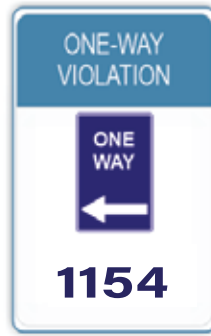
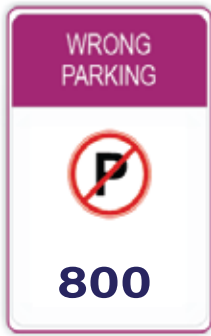
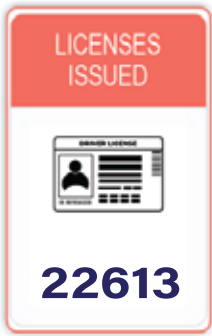
COMPARATIVE CONGESTION CHART

"In the month of December, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi demonstrated remarkable efforts in ensuring road safety and maintaining discipline on the streets. A total of **92559** challans were issued resulting in revenue of **73297450** PKR, highlighting the police's proactive approach to traffic management. Among these, **800**

challans were for no parking violations, while **1716** were issued for signal violations, underlining the importance of obeying traffic signals for smooth flow. A total of **1154** challans were issued for one-way violations, and **3827** for lane and line violations, ensuring that drivers adhere to designated traffic patterns. Additionally, **18200** drivers were penalized for driving without a valid license, and **5378** were fined for emitting excessive smoke, emphasizing environmental and safety concerns. Juvenile driving resulted in **4834** challans, with **2361** issued for lack of vehicle fitness. Furthermore, **3668** challans were issued for route permit violations, and **11340** for riding without helmets, demonstrating the Traffic Police's unwavering commitment to improving road safety and enforcement throughout Rawalpindi.



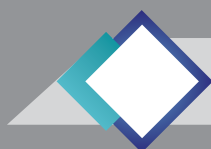
LICENSE SECTION

In December, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi achieved significant success in issuing new driving licenses, contributing to the promotion of road safety and legal compliance. A total of **22613** licenses were issued, reflecting a substantial effort in licensing and regulation. Of these, **20018** licenses were granted for motorcyclists, ensuring that a large number of riders are equipped with the necessary skills to drive safely. Additionally, **2097** licenses were issued for motor car drivers, while **107** licenses were granted for Light Transport Vehicle (LTV) drivers. Furthermore, **382** licenses were issued to motor rickshaw drivers and **7** HTV licenses were issued, reinforcing the commitment to maintain a well-regulated and responsible transportation system.



OUR LICENSING CENTERS AND MOBILE VAN

The City Traffic Police Rawalpindi operates several key licensing centers to provide easy access to the public. The main licensing center is located at Qasim Market, while additional branches can be found at the Cantt Licensing Center, Shahbaz Sharif Center, and in other areas such as Gojar Khan, Kahuta, Kallar Syedan, and Taxila. To further enhance convenience, CTP Rawalpindi has introduced a dedicated mobile licensing van that travels to various locations within Rawalpindi, including major educational institutions and private and public organizations. This initiative ensures that residents can access licensing services without the need to visit the main offices, making the process more accessible and efficient.



SPECIAL DUTIES DURING DECEMBER

SPECIAL DUTY ON 25 DECEMBER

On December 25th, in celebration of Christmas, the Rawalpindi City Traffic Police organized special duties to ensure smooth traffic flow around churches across the Rawalpindi region. Recognizing the significance of the day, a dedicated team of approximately 302 personnel was deployed to manage the increased number of worshippers attending services. Officers were stationed at key locations around churches to direct traffic, prevent congestion, and assist with parking, ensuring ease of access for all. Additionally, for the first time, speed cameras were deployed in the field to address the problem of overspeeding, ensuring greater safety during the busy holiday period. This combined effort demonstrated the Traffic Police's commitment to not only facilitating smooth traffic but also protecting the well-being of the community during this important religious occasion.



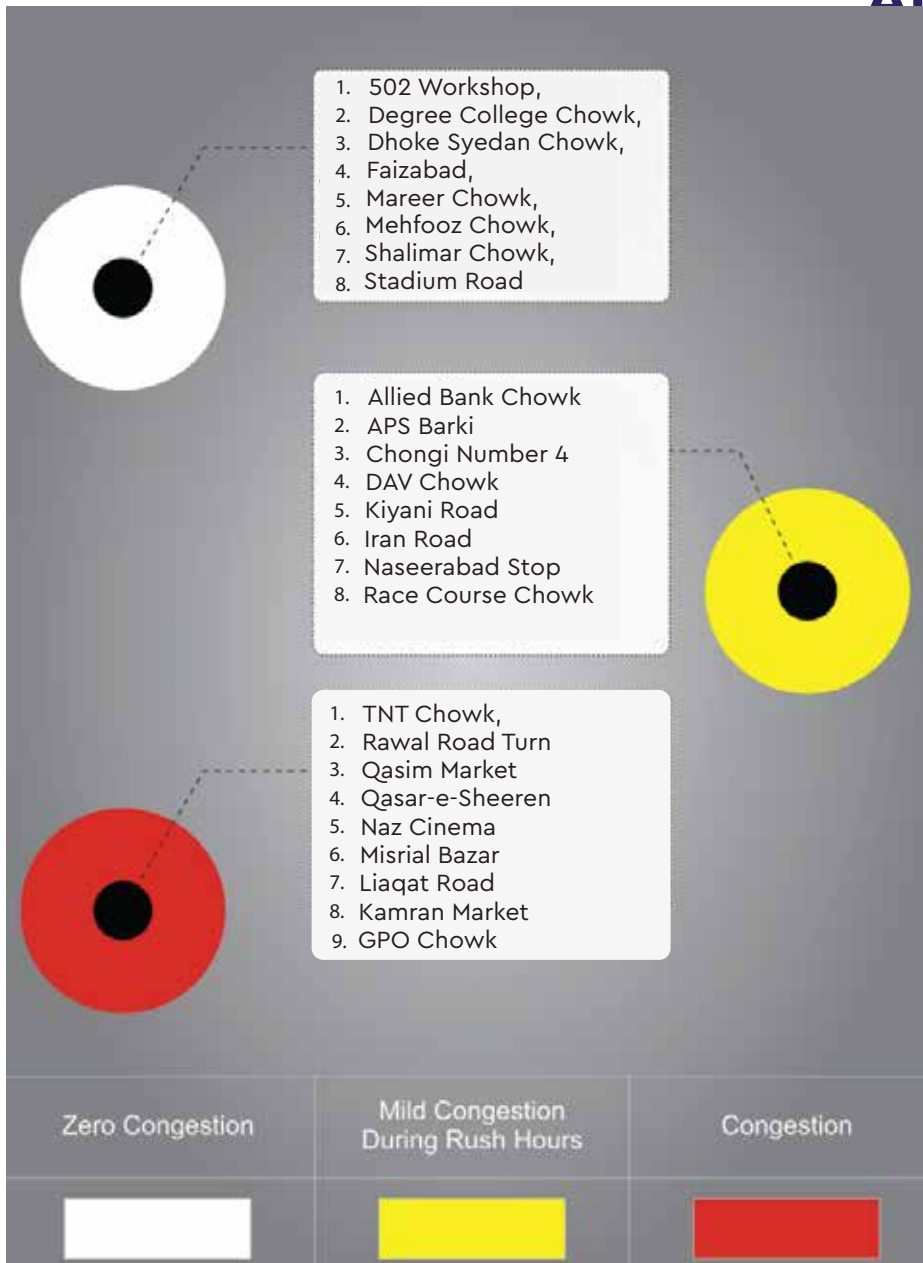
SPECIAL DUTY ON NEW YEAR NIGHT

On the night of December 31st, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi took proactive measures to ensure the safety and smooth flow of traffic amid the increased congestion and celebrations. To discourage dangerous activities such as one-wheeling and to manage the high volume of vehicles on the roads, a special duty was organized, with approximately 365 traffic staff allocated to key locations throughout the city. Officers were stationed at strategic points to maintain order, prevent illegal stunts, and ensure that traffic flowed efficiently despite the heavy movement of people and vehicles. In addition, speed cameras were deployed in the field to address the issue of overspeeding, ensuring greater control over dangerous driving behavior. Their presence played a crucial role in minimizing accidents and disruptions, ensuring a safe and smooth transition into the New Year for all commuters. The initiative highlighted the commitment of the Traffic Police to protect public safety and uphold traffic discipline during such high-traffic events.



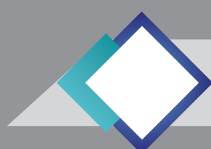
Anti-Congestion Campaign

In December, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi made significant strides in reducing congestion across key areas. Notable improvements were observed at 502 Workshop, Degree College Chowk, Dhoke Syedan Chowk, Faizabad, Mareer Chowk, Mehfooz Chowk, Shalimar Chowk, and Stadium Road, where congestion was effectively cleared. In areas such as Allied Bank Chowk, APS Barki, Chongi Number 4, DAV Chowk, Kiyani Road, Iran Road, Naseerabad Stop, and Race Course Chowk, mild congestion still persists; however, the situation has notably improved, with traffic moving more efficiently than before.

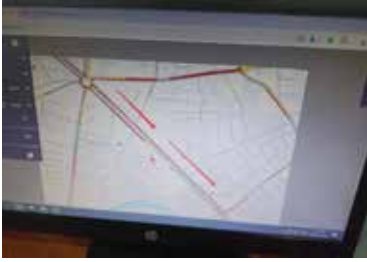

However, locations like TNT Chowk, Rawal Road Turn, Qasim Market, Qasar-e-Sheeren, Naz Cinema, Misrial Bazar, Liaqat Road, Kamran Market, and GPO Chowk continue to face heavy congestion. Despite this, the traffic is flowing without major blockages, and the congestion is a reflection of the high volume of business activity and pedestrian traffic in these bustling areas. Efforts to further alleviate traffic are ongoing.



THE TRAFFIC COMMAND AND CONTROL SYTEM



The Command and Control System in Rawalpindi has been meticulously designed to ensure real-time monitoring and management of traffic across the city. Leveraging advanced technology, the system provides comprehensive oversight of traffic flow, enabling authorities to identify and address congestion swiftly. By utilizing tools like Google Maps, the system allows traffic controllers to track and assess traffic conditions at any given moment, helping them pinpoint areas of heavy congestion or blockages.

In addition to real-time monitoring, the system is integrated with a communication network that includes Traffic Control and WhatsApp groups to ensure seamless coordination among sector in-charges. Once congestion or a traffic blockage is detected, immediate notifications are sent to the relevant sector in-charge, who can then take prompt action to alleviate the situation. Sector in-charges are responsible for clearing the affected areas, while also recording the incidents in a congestion diary.

SPECIAL CAMPAIGNS DURING DECEMBER

ANTI-ENCROACHMENT CAMPAIGN

In December, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi launched a special encroachment campaign aimed at clearing roadways and promoting a safer, more organized environment for both pedestrians and businesses. Under the leadership of the Chief Traffic Officer, the campaign was led in key commercial areas such as Raja Bazar, City Sadar Road, Ganjmandi Road, and Kashmiri Bazar and other areas. The Chief Traffic Officer personally supervised the operation, ensuring effective implementation of the clearance efforts. In addition, other officers worked diligently to address encroachment issues in various other areas of the city.



CAMPAIGN AGAINST NO PARKING

In December, the Rawalpindi City Traffic Police launched a comprehensive campaign to combat illegal parking in busy traffic areas, aiming to ensure the smooth flow of vehicles and reduce congestion. As part of this initiative, the dedicated lifter staff removed 5,029 illegally parked vehicles from high-traffic zones such as Sadar, Raja Bazar, Commercial Market, Tench, and other busy areas. This proactive measure significantly cleared the roads, allowing for safer and more efficient movement of traffic.



PSV MONITORING

A special campaign has been launched to closely monitor Public Service Vehicles (PSVs) in Rawalpindi, with a focus on ensuring compliance with traffic regulations. The campaign specifically targets the verification of driving licenses of PSV drivers, route permits, and fitness certificates. Additionally, PSVs found to be overloaded are fined accordingly.



CAMPAIGN AGAINST OVERLOADED SCHOOL VANS

In December, the Rawalpindi City Traffic Police, under the leadership of the Chief Traffic Officer, took proactive measures to ensure the safety of children by strictly enforcing regulations against overloaded school vans. Field officers diligently carried out inspections and issued fines to vehicles found carrying more students than the permissible limit.



CAMPAIGN AGAINST OVERLOADING

During December, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi launched a special campaign against overloading, targeting vehicles that posed a risk to public safety. Numerous challans were issued to violators, emphasizing the department's commitment to ensuring safer roads.

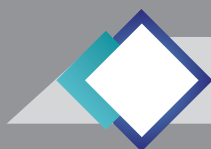
CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CONFERENCE HALL AT TRAFFIC HQ

In December, a significant milestone was achieved with the construction of a state-of-the-art conference hall for the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi. 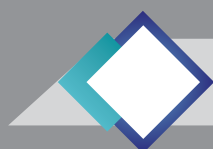
SIGNING OF MOU BETWEEN CTP RWP AND RIPHAAH MEDICAL SERVICES

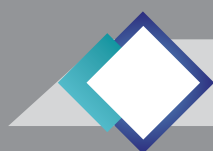


WOMEN ON WHEEL AND DRIVING SCHOOL

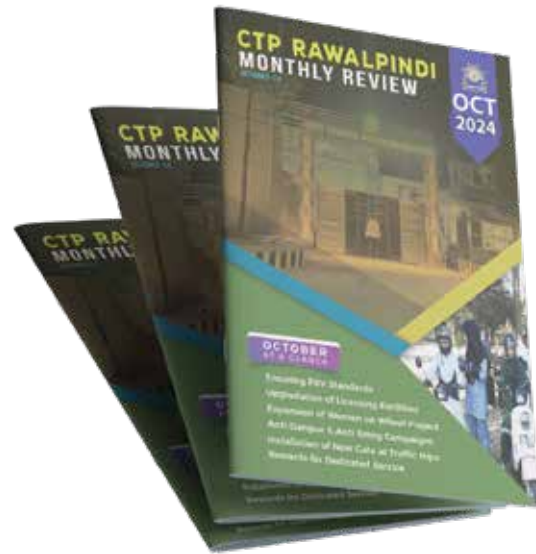
