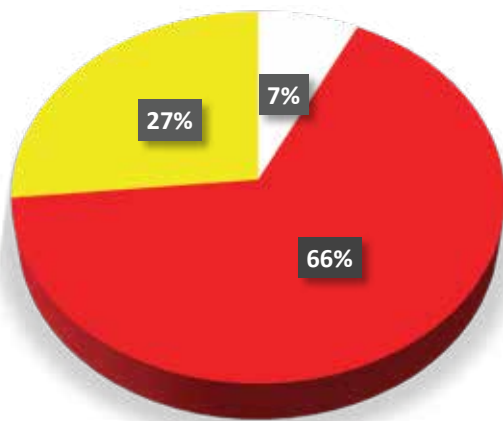
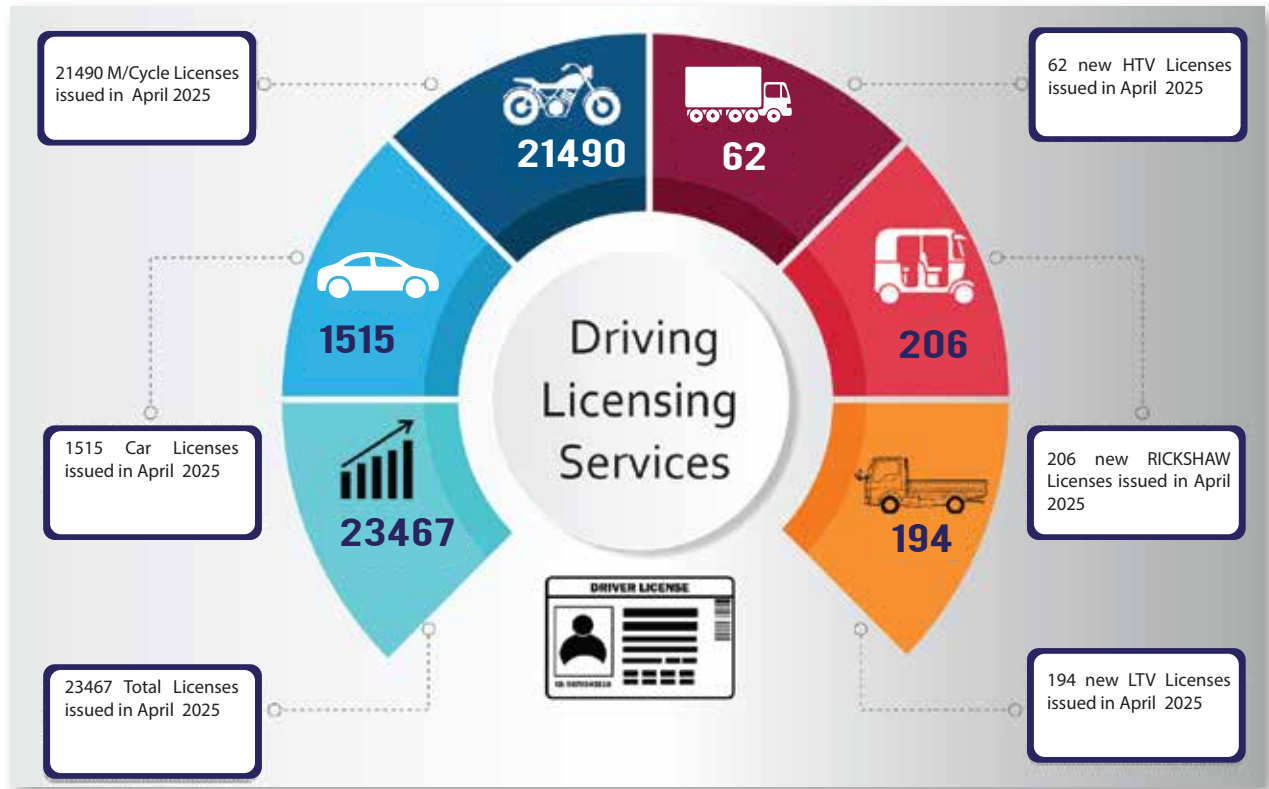

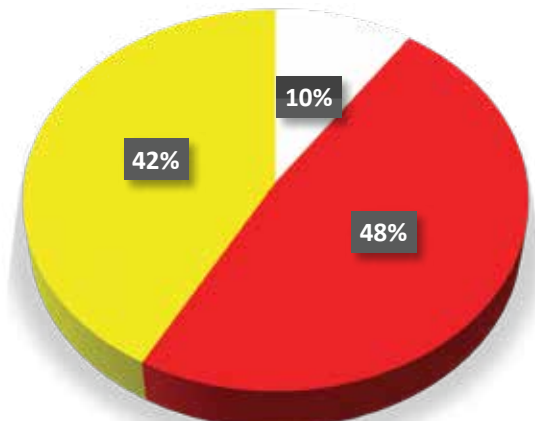

CHALLANING PERFORMANCE



During the month, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi demonstrated its continued commitment to road safety and traffic discipline through vigorous enforcement across the city. A total of **24,485** challans were issued for various traffic violations. Among the most common infractions was riding without a helmet, with **20,718**

challans, highlighting ongoing challenges in ensuring motorcyclist safety. Additionally, **19,246** individuals were fined for driving without a valid license, indicating the need for further public awareness and enforcement in this area. Line and lane violations also remained a major concern, accounting for **4,020** challans, which significantly impacts traffic flow and safety. Other notable violations included route permit violations **2,474**, juvenile driving **2,955**, and vehicles without valid fitness certificates **1,042**. Furthermore, the department addressed signal violations **967**, wrong-way driving **887**, and wrong parking **638**, all of which contribute to traffic congestion and accidents. Excessive smoke emissions, a threat to public health and the environment, led to **268** challans. These statistics reflect CTP Rawalpindi's unwavering efforts to uphold traffic laws and ensure safer roads for all citizens.

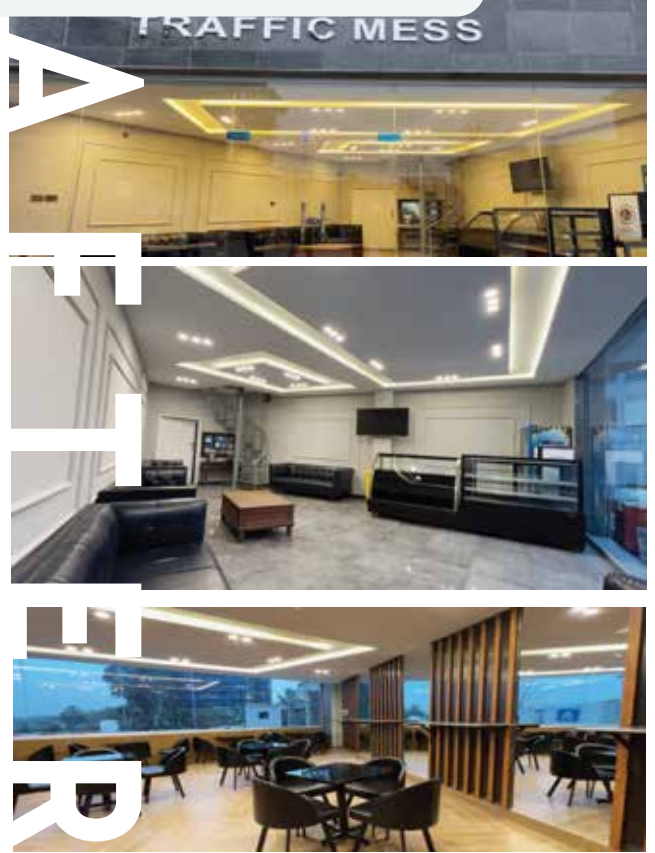

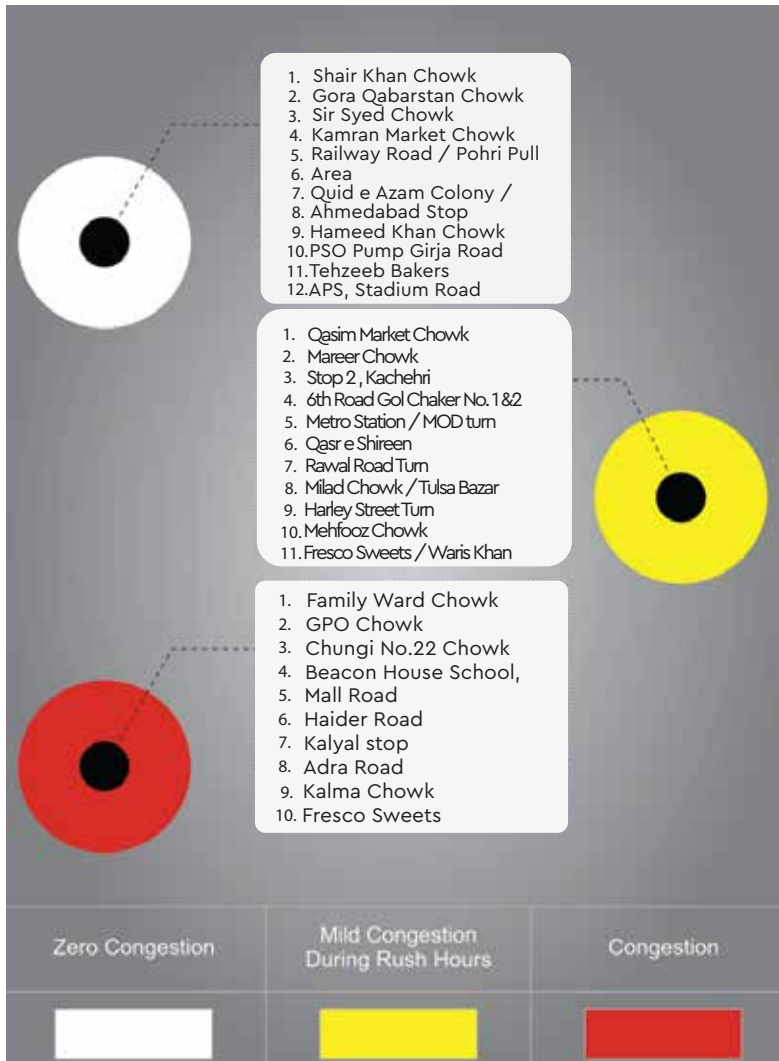

ANTI CONGESTION



Rawalpindi City Traffic Police launched a focused anti-congestion campaign in April, using real-time data from Google Maps to identify bottlenecks and dispatch staff promptly. Due to the tireless efforts of our field teams, several key areas were successfully kept congestion-free, including Shair Khan Chowk, Gora Qabarstan Chowk, Sir Syed Chowk, Kamran Market, Railway Road/Pohri Pull, Quaid-e-Azam Colony, Hameed Khan Chowk, PSO Pump (Girja Road), Tehzeeb Bakers, and APS Stadium Road. Our commitment continues toward smoother and safer roads for all citizens.

During April, mild congestion was noted in areas such as Qasim Market Chowk, Mareer Chowk, Stop 2 (Kachehri), 6th Road Gol Chakkar No. 1 & 2, Metro Station/MOD Turn, Qasr-e-Shireen, Rawal Road Turn, Milad Chowk/Tulsa Bazar, Harley Street Turn, Mehfooz Chowk, and Fresco Sweets/Waris Khan.

This was primarily due to the Signal-Free Mall Road Project, school timings, and nearby business activity. Despite the increased volume, no complete traffic blockages occurred. Traffic flow was slow but steady. Our control center used Google Maps for live monitoring and timely staff deployment. The Rawalpindi Traffic Police remains dedicated to maintaining urban mobility even under challenging conditions.

During peak hours, high congestion was observed in key areas including Family Ward Chowk, GPO Chowk, Chungi No.22 Chowk, Beaconhouse School (Mall Road), Haider Road, Kalyal Stop, Adra Road, and Kalma Chowk. This was primarily due to overlapping school schedules and busy business hours, leading to increased vehicle volume and slower movement. Despite the pressure, traffic staff remained actively deployed to manage flow and prevent gridlock. Continuous monitoring through Google Maps allowed timely response and better traffic regulation in these high-demand zones.

Licensing campaign

During the month of April, the City Traffic Police Department maintained steady momentum in licensing operations, issuing a total of 23,467 driving licenses across various vehicle categories. A significant majority comprised motorcycle licenses, with 21,490 issued, reflecting the continued high demand in this segment. Motor car licenses followed at 1,515, while 206 licenses were granted for rickshaw drivers. In the commercial vehicle category, 194 Light Transport Vehicle (LTV) and 62 Heavy Transport Vehicle (HTV) licenses were issued.



NEW MOTOR CAR SIMULATOR

The newly introduced Motor Car Simulator at the Traffic Office is a valuable training tool for driving school students. This locally made simulator is designed to provide realistic driving experiences, allowing students to practice their skills in a controlled, virtual environment. With a focus on minimizing costs, the simulator has been created with the utmost efficiency, ensuring that it is both affordable and highly effective in training future drivers. All operations and maintenance of the simulator are handled locally, providing a cost-effective solution while supporting the community.



NEW HTV SIMULATOR

The Heavy Transport Vehicle (HTV) Simulator at the Traffic Office is another significant addition to the training resources available for driving school students. Like the motor car simulator, the HTV simulator is locally manufactured at minimal cost, ensuring that it remains accessible to all. This simulator provides students with a safe and controlled space to practice operating large vehicles, enhancing their skills before taking on the real road. The entire operation and maintenance of the HTV simulator are managed locally, making it an efficient and sustainable tool for improving driving standards in the region.



Helmet Safety Campaign

In April, the City Traffic Police Rawalpindi actively promoted road safety through a focused helmet awareness campaign. A total of 20,718 challans were issued to motorcyclists found riding without helmets.



No Parking Campaign

To ensure smoother traffic flow and prevent congestion, the department intensified its no-parking campaign in April. The traffic staff removed 6143 wrongly parked vehicle as part of no parking campaign.



Anti-Encroachment Drive

Our dedicated anti-encroachment teams conducted regular operations in Raja Bazar, Range Road, Saddar, Adyala Road, Murree Road, and other busy commercial areas.



Campaign Against Overloading

To enhance road safety and reduce vehicle-related risks, the department carried out an intensive drive against vehicle overloading. A total of 2,085 challans were issued to transporters and drivers violating permissible load limits.



Campaign against Tinted and Black Paper

A total of 3,758 challans were issued during April to vehicle owners using unauthorized tinted glasses and papers. The campaign targeted vehicles that compromise visibility and violate motor vehicle rules.



Checking of Public Service Vehicles (PSVs)

To ensure passenger safety and avoid mishaps, our teams carried out thorough inspections of Public Service Vehicles (PSVs). This included checking vehicle documents, driver licenses, fitness certificates, and monitoring speed limits.

Traffic Management During PSL Matches in Rawalpindi

In April 2025, Rawalpindi had the honor of hosting Pakistan Super League (PSL) matches at the iconic Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium—an area known for its strategic location at the intersection of Rawalpindi and Islamabad. The stadium's proximity to bustling commercial centers and densely populated residential areas posed a significant logistical challenge in terms of traffic control and public mobility. Despite these complexities, City Traffic Police Rawalpindi rose to the occasion with exceptional professionalism and preparedness. Detailed traffic management plans were executed to ensure a seamless flow of vehicles while maintaining tight security protocols.

The traffic police deployed additional personnel, created special diversion routes, and utilized smart traffic monitoring systems to avoid congestion during match hours. Efforts were made to guarantee that school and office timings remained undisrupted, preserving the daily routine of citizens while accommodating large matchday crowds and VIP movement. Coordination with other law enforcement agencies and the use of digital communication platforms helped ensure real-time updates to the public. The successful execution of the PSL traffic duty not only demonstrated the tactical strength of CTP Rawalpindi but also earned widespread appreciation from the public for managing high-pressure situations with efficiency and precision.



CTO's VISIT TO NUML UNIVERSITY VISIT

In April 2025, Chief Traffic Officer Rawalpindi, Beenish Fatima, visited the Rawalpindi campus of the National University of Modern Languages (NUML), where she delivered an insightful and engaging lecture on road safety and traffic awareness. Addressing a large gathering of students and faculty members, CTO Rawalpindi emphasized the critical importance of responsible driving habits, adherence to traffic rules, and the role of educated youth in shaping a safer traffic environment. Her session included real-life case studies, statistics on road accidents, and interactive discussions aimed at encouraging behavioral change among young drivers. The students responded with enthusiasm, asking questions and expressing a keen interest in becoming ambassadors of road safety in their communities.

During her visit, CTO Rawalpindi also shed light on several new initiatives introduced by City Traffic Police Rawalpindi to enhance public service and driving education. These included the launch of specialized driving courses tailored to different segments of society, posting of ladies circle officers and lady licensing incharge at Shahbaz Shareef Park Licensing Center first time, integration of modern simulators for hands-on training, and the appointment of female driving instructors to empower women drivers. A highlight of the discussion was the expansion of the Women on Wheels project, with the addition of four new scooters to facilitate greater female mobility. She also announced the opening of a new state-of-the-art driving school at the Traffic Office, Chandni Chowk, designed to offer practical training in a safe and professional environment. Her address underscored CTP Rawalpindi's commitment to innovation, inclusivity, and public engagement in creating safer roads for all.

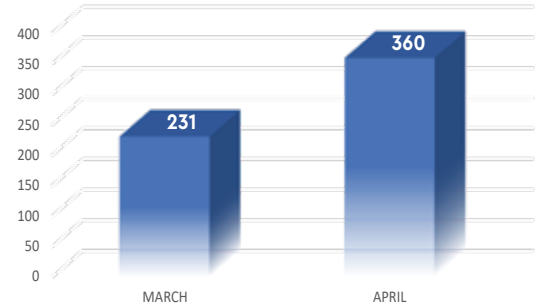

DRIVING SCHOOL AND WOMEN AND WHEEL

In April, the Driving School of City Traffic Police Rawalpindi achieved notable success following a key initiative by CTO Rawalpindi. For the first time, motor car driving courses were held twice a month instead of once, significantly boosting public participation. Additionally, short specialized courses were also introduced to cater to diverse learning needs. As a result, student enrollment rose sharply—from **231** in **March** to **360** in **April**. Our Women on Wheels program also gained momentum, with 15 female students registering for scooty and bike training, highlighting the growing impact of our efforts to promote women's mobility and empowerment.



LTV DRIVING COURSE FOR LADIES

The City Traffic Police Rawalpindi has proudly launched a new LTV (Light Transport Vehicle) training course exclusively for women at its Driving School, marking a significant milestone in women's empowerment.

Reverse Parking Course


The Reverse Parking Course is designed to enhance driver control and confidence in tight parking situations. Trainees learn precise techniques for reversing into various types of parking spots, including parallel and angle parking.

Mechanical Awareness Course

This course equips learners with basic knowledge about the mechanical components of a vehicle. Participants are introduced to essential systems such as brakes, engine, suspension, and transmission.

Highway Driving Course

The Highway Driving Course focuses on the skills needed for safe and confident driving on motorways and highways. Drivers are trained in lane discipline, overtaking techniques, proper use of mirrors, and maintaining safe speeds and distances.

LADIES MPAs VISIT TO TRAFFIC HQ

In April, a group of female Members of the Provincial Assembly (MPAs) visited the City Traffic Police (CTP) Headquarters Rawalpindi on the special occasion of launching the first-ever LTV (Light Transport Vehicle) training course for women. Chief Traffic Officer (CTO) Rawalpindi, Madam Beenish Fatima, welcomed the delegation and gave a detailed briefing on the various initiatives and reforms introduced by the CTP. She highlighted the significance of the LTV course in creating employment opportunities for women and promoting gender inclusion in the field of professional driving.

Students from the CTP Driving School were also present during the event, reflecting the growing participation of women in traffic awareness and driving training. CTO Madam Beenish Fatima emphasized the department's continued focus on engaging the public through education campaigns, traffic seminars, and community outreach programs. The MPAs appreciated the launch of this pioneering course and lauded CTP Rawalpindi's efforts in empowering women and improving road safety through structured training and innovation.



16 STWs GOT PROMOTED IN CTP RWP

Sixteen Senior Traffic Wardens in Rawalpindi have recently been promoted to the rank of Traffic Officer, marking a significant step forward in their professional careers. Out of sixteen Senior Traffic Wardens recently promoted to the rank of Traffic Officer, eight have been posted within Rawalpindi, while the remaining eight have been assigned to postings outside the city. These newly promoted officers have officially taken charge of their respective postings and have begun fulfilling their duties with renewed commitment and responsibility.



OPEN DAY

As part of the Open Day program, students from Beaconhouse School visited the City Traffic Police Headquarters Rawalpindi. They were warmly welcomed and given a detailed road safety lecture by Chief Traffic Officer (CTO) Rawalpindi. During the visit, students explored various branches of the HQ including the FM Radio Unit and License Branch. They also got a firsthand look at operational gadgets such as motor-bikes, scooties, wireless sets, and reflectors. The visit aimed to give students insight into the everyday functioning and responsibilities of the City Traffic Police.

REWARD

City Traffic Police Rawalpindi honored 63 dedicated staff members for their outstanding performance. The rewarded personnel included 7 Senior Traffic Wardens, 33 Traffic Wardens, 2 Senior Traffic Assistants, 15 Traffic Assistants, and 6 from the ministerial quota. A total cash reward of Rs. 123,000 was distributed among them. The initiative aimed to boost morale and recognize their commitment to duty.

ACCIDENTS

Despite the tireless and humanly possible efforts of City Traffic Police Rawalpindi, the city witnessed 9 fatal and 16 non-fatal accidents. In these unfortunate incidents, 9 people lost their lives while 18 sustained injuries. As a large and bustling city, Rawalpindi faces constant traffic challenges requiring public cooperation.

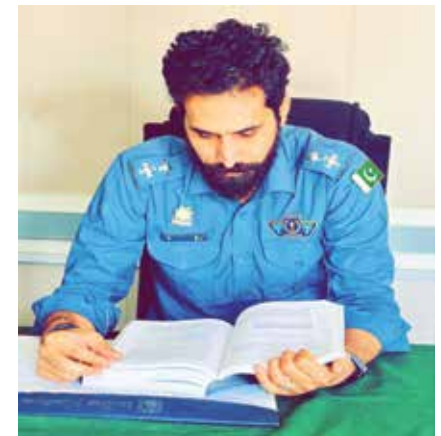
Danish Nazeer_ Black Belt in Taekwondo
